

Finding a dentist in your plan's network

- 1. Visit unicare.com/find-care/ to Find Care.
- 2. To initiate a search:
 - Guests may choose Basic search as a guest.
 - Members have two options:
 - Log in for Personalized Search
 - Use Member ID for Basic Search to search without logging in
 - Use the drop-down menu to Select the type of plan or network and choose Dental Plan or Network.
 - Use the drop-down menu to Select the state where the plan or network is offered.
 - Use the drop-down menu to **Select how you get health insurance** to select **Dental**.
 - Use the drop-down menu to Select a plan or network and choose Dental 100/200/300 Access.
 - Select Continue.
